Chincoteague-born pony shares his art at Pony Penning 2011

CHINCOTEAGUE — He's coming back. It seems that if you have saltwater in your veins you just can't stay away from Chincoteague Island for too long. The same must be true for ponies as well, because Minnow, the painting pony, will again be making his trek to Chincoteague for Pony Penning. He will appear at the Chincoteague Pony Centre and demonstrate his skills as a master artist during the week.

His brushstrokes flow effortlessly across the canvas as he stands attentive and focused, waiting to be handed a new brush dripping with paint. With each stroke, his tail swishes back and forth in a pleased and content manner. Finally, his masterpiece is complete.

The canvas is filled with colorful abstract brushstrokes that seem to resemble a flock of birds or perhaps a band of wild horses. The artist is Chincoteague Minnow and he is a 1993 islandborn Chincoteague pony that loves to paint.

Minnow has been painting since January

2007 and each painting is an original work of art created solely from his imagination. Minnow has sold hundreds of paintings all over the world through his website, www.PaintingPony.com. Through the sale of his works, he has raised money to help numerous animal rescues and

charities. Each painting

is a one-of-a-kind

original that comes signed by the artist and includes a certificate of authenticity.

Minnow, under the direction of his owner/trainer Kyley DiLuigi of Downingtown, Pa., will be appearing in the pony show at the Chincoteague Pony Centre Monday through Thursday at 4 and 8 p.m. and on Friday at the 4 p.m. show. In addition to painting before the show (so come early to see him paint), a painting will be auctioned off to the highest bidder during

each performance. A portion of the proceeds will go to charity. Minnow and DiLuigi will also be performing tricks as part of the daily pony show that showcases both Misty family ponies and veterans of the swim.

After winning the 2010 Equine Extravaganza Talent Contest with his trusty sidekick, Ammo the Dachshund, Minnow has revamped his trick performance for Pony Penning in 2011. This year's performance at the Chincoteague Pony Centre promises to be even more thrilling, with new tricks that will keep you laughing all week.

After developing

ringbone (a form of equine arthritis) at the young age of 15, Minnow was facing a very early retirement from his riding career as a successful mounted games pony. But DiLuigi knew he was destined for greatness and began training Minnow to perform tricks as a way to keep his mind active. Four years later and Minnow has been showcasing his talents across the country and making people everywhere smile. Minnow and Ammo even appeared on Animal Planet's "America's Cutest Dogs" in 2009.

Now Minnow is passing along his talents to his

younger brothers, Chesapeake Lightning and Chesapeake Boomerang. With the great Minnow as their teacher, these young Chincoteague ponies have been blazing a path of their own. This past February, Boomerang competed in Craig Cameron's Extreme Cowbov Race at the Horse World Expo in Harrisburg, Pa. Placing in the Top 6, Boomerang, a Surfer Dude grandson. wowed the crowd as he

navigated obstacles in his bitless bridle showing everyone just how talented these Chincoteague ponies can be.

Chincoteague Minnow is an alumnus of the Chincoteague Pony Centre, where he resided in years past. The Pony Centre not only breeds, raises and trains quality Chincoteague ponies but also sells foals to fully
